Beebe presents awards

The hoards of directors of Beebe Medical Center and the Beebe Medical Foundation recently presented four prestigious philanthropic and service awards to individuals who have made a significant difference to Beebe and to the quality of healthcare it brings to the communities it serves.

The Norman B. Baylis Award, which honors a community member for outstanding service to healthcare and to the broader community, was presented to Rehoboth Beach resident James J. Martin. In 1999, after the death of his wife Joan and her friend Jean James. Martin established the Jean and Joan Fund to provide care and comfort for cancer patients during their battle against the disease. The fund sponsors a golf tournament at Kings Creek Country Club each year that so far has raised more than \$162,000 for Beebe Medical Center's Tunnell Cancer Center, Martin, now retired, moved to the Rehoboth Beach area with his wife in 1980 from Arizona to become vice president and general manager of Barcroft Chemical Manufacturing Facility in Lewes, now known as SPI Pharma. Martin is a Korean War Veteran and was a 1st Lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps.

The John W. Rollins Award, an humanitarian and philanthropist award that honors a person for giving of his or her talents and resources to directly promote the betterment of our society, was presented to Joseph R. Hudson. Hudson, a local developer, business owner and entrepreneur with deep roots in Sussex County, has long been a supporter of Beebe Medical Center. Hudson has served on the Medical Center's hoard of directors since 1986. He served as chairman from 1998 to 2005. Presently he serves as vice chairman of the Board of

Directors for the Beebe Medical Foundation, the fundraising arm of the organization. He was recently honored with the Lifetime Achievement Award by the Sussex County's Positive Growth Alliance for commitment in improving the quality of life for all residents and visitors to southern Delaware.

The Robert W. Tunnell Award, which honors a member of the Beebe Medical Center family for the efforts put forth to directly help Beebe Medical Center meet future healthcare challenges and to insure that Beebe maintains its leadership in healthcare, was presented to Dr. James P. Marvel. Marvel has worked as an orthopaedic surgeon in Lewes

since 1980 and is a member of the Beebe Medical Staff. The grandson of one of Beebe Medical Center's founders, Dr. James Beebe Sr., Marvel attended Jefferson Medical School in Philadelphia and worked at the Pennsylvania Hospital Philadelphia before returning to Beebe Medical Center, Marvel has served two terms as president of the Medical Society of Delaware, Chief of Staff of the Beebe Medical Center and Chief of Surgery Service. He presently serves as the Medical Center's Trauma director.
